



Undo operations

Startup Organizer allows you to undo any operation that you have done on the programs list. You can safely do what you want and revert to the previous state when necessary.

You can also make multiple backup configurations to restore if you have done something wrong or if you need to switch configurations quickly.

Startup Organizer also can compare backup file with the current configuration.

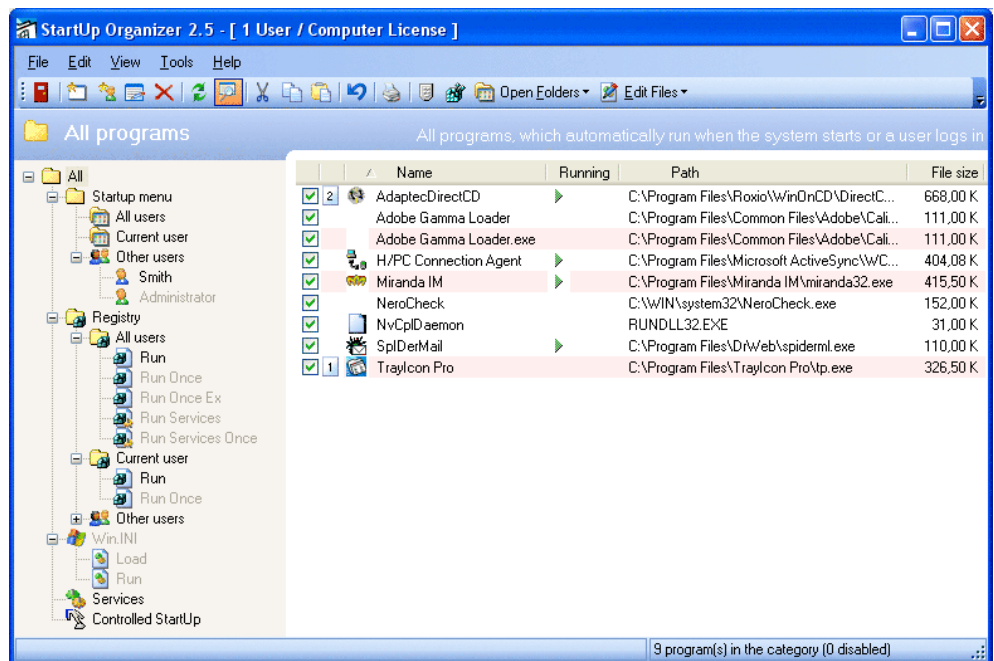

Users of Windows NT 4.0/2000/XP/2003 can benefit from the new ability to work with other users` startup configurations. Startup Organizer displays other users among your standard Registry, Controlled Startup and Start menu items. You can view programs of other users, edit them, add new ones and drag programs to them.

You can even add programs to multiple users with just a few clicks!

Real-time monitoring

StartUp Organizer offers a real-time monitoring system to alert you when your startup configuration is being changed by a third-party program. This monitoring can be set to warn you when a trojan or other spyware is inserted into your startup processing. It can also be set to automatically ban such programs from being included in your startup process. You can even automatically detect and remove programs which were added to your startup configuration by other software, and easily restore them if, in fact, they don` t pose a security threat.
